 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Mid-South Oilseed
 - 5 Double Cropping Study Act of 2025".

1	SEC. 2. STUDY ON INCLUSION OF CERTAIN OILSEED CROPS
2	UNDER DOUBLE AND ROTATIONAL CROP-
3	PING POLICIES.
4	Section 522(c) of the Federal Crop Insurance Act (7
5	U.S.C. 1522(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6	lowing:
7	"(20) Double Cropping and Rotational
8	CROPPING OF CERTAIN OILSEED CROPS.—
9	"(A) Definition of covered oilseed
10	CROPS.—In this paragraph, the term 'covered
11	oilseed crops' means rapeseed and canola crops
12	that—
13	"(i) require a period of cold tempera-
14	ture (vernalization) before the crops will
15	produce flowers and seeds; and
16	"(ii) are planted and harvested on
17	land that would otherwise be idle in a rota-
18	tion pattern.
19	"(B) Research and Development.—
20	The Corporation shall carry out research and
21	development, or offer to enter into 1 or more
22	contracts with 1 or more qualified persons to
23	carry out research and development, with re-
24	spect to the inclusion of covered oilseed crops
25	under double cropping and rotational cropping
26	policies.

1	"(C) REQUIREMENTS.—The research and
2	development carried out pursuant to subpara-
3	graph (B) shall be conducted in consultation
4	with stakeholders to evaluate—
5	"(i) the factors impacting availability
6	and cost of crop insurance when incor-
7	porating covered oilseed crops into double
8	cropping and rotational cropping policies
9	and
10	"(ii) the potential risk management
11	benefits associated with incorporating cov-
12	ered oilseed crops into double cropping and
13	rotational cropping policies, including risk
14	management benefits to soil health, bio-
15	diversity, and the profitability of farming
16	operations.
17	"(D) Emphasis.—In awarding contracts
18	under subparagraph (B), the Corporation may
19	place emphasis on qualified persons and institu-
20	tions that—
21	"(i) have previous research experience
22	with covered oilseed crops; and
23	"(ii) have access to a facility with the
24	capacity to carry out the applicable re-
25	search.

1	"(E) Report.—Not later than 13 months
2	after the date of enactment of this paragraph,
3	the Corporation shall submit to the Committee
4	on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the
5	Senate and the Committee on Agriculture of
6	the House of Representatives a report that de-
7	scribes—
8	"(i) the results of the research and
9	development carried out under subpara-
10	graph (B); and
11	"(ii) any recommendations with re-
12	spect to those results.".
